COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The Homiletics Practicum builds on a theology of preaching developed in *Introduction to Preaching* and applications in *Advanced Preaching*. *The Practicum* gives seminarians an opportunity to refine their homiletic skills by focusing on challenging preaching situations.. It also gives them the opportunity to articulate their understanding of preaching and its place in their ministry.

CLASS OBJECTIVES:

Upon successful completion of this course the student will have reliably demonstrated the ability to do the following:

1. **identify the characteristics of outstanding preaching from personal practice;**
2. **determine and respond to key issues, challenges and questions in homiletics from personal practice;**
3. **explain and employ methods for preparing to preach;**
4. **identify and employ a variety of homiletic resources;**
5. **employ the assessment of specific congregations in preaching preparation and development;**
6. **articulate and employ effective methods of delivery**
7. **preach in different contexts;**
8. **revise preaching based on feedback;**
9. **assess strengths, provide constructive feedback, determine goals and point out areas for improvement in their own preaching and in the preaching of others.**
