COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The Christological-Trinitarian foundation of Mary's role in salvation history and in the Church is developed in two areas: (1) the foundations from Vatican II, Scripture, Church Fathers, and the four Marian dogmas; (2) the celebration of Mary in liturgy, popular piety, and spirituality. Finally, Mary is studied in light of ecumenism, and in one contemporary theologian and twentieth-century developments for her profound significance for today.

CLASS OBJECTIVES:

1. ***The Renewal of Mariology at Vatican II - [The New]***
The transition from Mary's Privileges to her role in redemption. Mary as "indissolubly linked" to Christ and as representing, together with the Church, the "woman" of Genesis and Revelation.
2. ***Mary in Scripture and Church Fathers- [The Fonts]***
Mary as linked to the Church as representing the "woman" of Genesis and Revelation. Mary as symbolized by women in the Old Testament. Mary primarily in Luke and John in texts that point to fulfillment of a new covenant.
3. ***Mary in the History of the Church - [The History]***
The four ages of Marian spirituality and development. The link between the times-culture and the form of Marian veneration and spirituality. The twentieth-century development that has led to the present form of Marian emphasis and spirituality.
4. ***The 4 Marian Dogmas - [The Dogmas]***
The history of the developments of the four Marian dogmas. Their theological support and significance for the Church's life.
5. ***Mary as Celebrated in the Church's liturgy and Devotion - [The Form]***
The understanding of the presence of Christ to the Church in the liturgy. Mary as present in the liturgy. The form of her presence in the liturgy. The forms of devotion. Pilgrimages and Apparitions.
6. ***Mary and Protestantism - [Objection to Mary's Role]***
The Protestant opposition to Catholic veneration of Mary. The role of mediation. The possibility of Mary's role as "mediatrix."
7. ***Mary in von Balthasar's "Marian Principle" and vision of her contemporaneity today [Mary Today]***
The Marian Principle of von Balthasar. Her exalted role within a Trinitarian vision. Mary as representing the laity at Vatican II and her form of presence in the Lay Movements.

PREREQUISITES:

This course presupposes that the student has either studied or is currently taking a course on Christology; other interested students should see the instructor.
