COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course considers the foundation, nature, structure and mission of the Catholic Church, with particular, though not exclusive, attention to the teachings of the Second Vatican Council.

LEARNING OUTCOMES To:

1. Identify and become familiar with some foundational teachings of Catholic ecclesiology, located in important sources, relative to central themes, with a particular focus upon the teaching of Vatican II concerning the origin, nature and mission of the Church.
2. Learn how to interpret ecclesiological questions according to the mind of the Church by exposure to first-rate practitioners of the Tradition.
3. Develop an appropriate vocabulary in the area of ecclesiology.
4. Recognize the relevance of ecclesiological teachings, not only for the broader enterprise of theology, but also for contemporary living, pastoral ministry and ecumenism.
5. Grow in historical knowledge of the context in which these ecclesiological teachings have appeared, come under scrutiny, and reappeared.
6. Apply knowledge and skills in exercises that permit them to communicate understandings and insights regarding the origin, nature and mission of the Church and the relevance of these understandings and insights for worship, ministry and citizenship.
