The Association of Theological Schools (ATS) has approved our extension site in Aurora and our online courses. In order to meet the ATS standards and be eligible for degree completion, a student whose initial registration is May 2008 or later must take a minimum of 10 courses on our main campus sites, without exception. Students may take up to 10 courses online. If students take courses at an extension site, these credits will be allocated to the latter category. Courses taken through St. Augustine's at the Toronto School of Theology that fall within the extension site and online course category will be tracked appropriately. Students whose initial registration is January 2008 or prior also have credit restrictions and should contact the Director for details.
