COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Introduction to Homiletics is a one-semester course that gives students the opportunity to look at the theology, tradition and practice of Catholic preaching. Students will examine particular questions, issues and challenges in homiletics from a Catholic perspective, survey the development of preaching throughout Church history, and articulate the characteristics and practice of good preaching. This course is a prerequisite for Advanced Homiletics.

COURSE OUTCOMES OR OBJECTIVES:

- 1. define the Catholic understanding of homily;
- 2. identify what the Church asks of its homilists;
- 3. differentiate Catholic liturgical preaching from preaching in other situations and in other traditions;
- 4. determine and respond to key issues, challenges and questions in homiletics;
- 5. identify the characteristics of outstanding preaching;
- 6. explain methods for preparing to preach;
- 7. identify important developments in the history of Catholic preaching;
