

DIPLOMA IN LAY MINISTRY CURRICULUM

*This programme may be completed online with the exception of the capstone course noted below.
Please contact the Academic Advisor for details.*

Purpose: *To offer to those already serving or hoping to serve as Lay Ministers the chance to enhance their ministry through theological education. This is not a certification programme but rather a co-ordinated combination of introductory courses.*

Goal: *To provide a theological foundation allowing the student to focus on areas related to his or her personal ministerial goals.*

Admissions Requirements:

1. Academic Application with Letter of Intent and three Letters of Recommendation.
2. Bachelor's degree or mature student with an appropriate background.
3. Official Transcripts from all post-secondary institutions.

The Diploma programme may be done on a part-time or full-time basis.

Cases which involve Advanced Standing, Shared Credits or Transfer Credits are dealt with according to the regulations found in the SAS *Bulletin*, the SAS Website, and the TST *Basic Degree Handbook*.

Courses completed in the diploma programme may be eligible for transfer to a degree programme depending on the academic eligibility of the student and the grade received for the course. Please review article **11.9** of the TST *Basic Degree Handbook* which further explains the policy regarding grades earned in the 60-69 range. Courses receiving these grades are counted towards our diploma programmes but are not transferable to a master's level programme.

Please note: *Students who wish to take courses from other Toronto School of Theology Colleges, or outside of the approved curriculum, must contact Ms. Connolly before entering your registration.*
