COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course explores the mystery of the Church as seen in the light of Vatican II. The aim is to understand what ecclesial communion means; to study the visible structure of that communion, and to reflect upon the missionary nature of the Church. We study the Catholic Church within the ecumenical reality of the entire Christian church in the world today.

Students will:

- Be introduced to central issues in understanding the nature, structure and mission of the Church
- Understand better the ecclesiological teaching of the Second Vatican Council
- Explore their own questions and ideas about the Church, and their place and ministry within it
