Two New Faculty Members Join
St. Augustine's

t. Augustine's is pleased to welcome two new members of the faculty. Joining us are Fr. Eric Rodrigues from the Archdiocese of Toronto and Fr. Ante Market from the Diocese of Peterborough.

Both are from Toronto and bring unique backgrounds to their new positions.

Fr. Rodrigues was ordained in 2009, having left a career as an Epidemiologist to become a priest. He served at Toronto's Blessed Trinity Parish from 2009-2011 before assuming duties as Pontifical Master of Ceremonies from 2011-2014. He spent the last five years working on a Doctorate in Sacred Theology (S.T.D.) (area of specialization — dogmatic theology) at the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome.

He has a Research Fellowship at Duke University, Center for Jewish Studies and a Scholarship for the Study of Modern Greek — Apostoliki Diakonia of the Orthodox Church of Greece. He also holds a Brenninkmeijer-Werhahn Fellowship — Hebrew University of Jerusalem.

Fr. Market was ordained in 2011. He served the parish of St. Thomas More in Millbrook, ON; Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Assumption, ON and the Cathedral of St. Peter-in-Chains in Peterborough. He studied at the Pontifical



Gregorian University in Rome and has a License in Canon Law with a Doctorate in Canon Law pending.





# St. Augustine's Alumnus, Most Reverend Matthew Ustrzycki, Offers Words of Wisdom to Today's Seminarians



s St. Augustine's honoured its alumni, one of its guests of honour, 87-year-old Most Reverend Matthew F. Ustrzycki, offered some simple yet poignant advice to guide young seminarians in their lives —"make room to spend time with your Lord."

Bishop Ustrzycki, Auxiliary Bishop Emeritus of Hamilton Diocese and St. Augustine's alumnus (Class of 1959), preached at the Alumni Day Mass on September 18, 2019. In conversation before the day, he reminisced about his days at the Seminary and the lessons he learned.

"You have to make room to spend time with your Lord," he said. "You can't give what you haven't got. That principle is as true today as it was then."

That relationship with Christ only comes through prayer and spending time in his presence — something that was instilled in

him at St. Augustine's.

"To me, as a seminarian, one of the beautiful things was that every Thursday we had a Holy Hour," he remembered. "It was voluntary, but yet the Chapel was always about 80 per cent full."

Invigorated by that relationship with the Lord, he says, we must all take that light out into the world.

"We talk a lot about evangelization, which is great, but what attracts people to Christ is when they see an individual who is doing his best to live out the life of Christ in his own life," he said. "Evangelization for each of us boils down to the nitty-gritty things of every day — your gentle smile, that pat on the back to encourage someone, listening to someone. It really is the little things that attract people to Christ."

# Moving Forward on the New General Plan for Priestly Formation

arrying out its universal responsibility for seminaries, the Congregation for the Clergy produced a new, general plan for priestly formation in 2016 entitled, The Gift of the Priestly Formation.

To assist the rectors and formation teams

in Canada to appreciate this new document and assist us in producing a renewed Canadian programme for priestly formation, St. Augustine's Seminary on April 4–7, 2019 hosted a symposium.

The Archbishop Secretary for Seminaries

of the Congregation for the Clergy, Jorge Carlos Patrón Wong, came from Rome to facilitate the gathering of about 40 seminary formators from English-speaking Canada. He spoke with enthusiasm, experience and encouragement about the new programme points: priestly formation begins in Baptism and must continue after ordination; a spiritual year is now an essential element of every Seminary; the first years when philosophy is studied is to be regarded as "discipleship stage" and during theology the formation focus is a "configuration stage."

There were also presentations updating what the seminaries are developing in both the spiritual year and pastoral year (internship) as well as an overview of the need for aboriginal issues to be part of training of Canadian priests.

Now the bishops of Canada, aided by the seven Rectors of the English-speaking seminaries, must produce a new Canadian programme for priestly formation reflecting the approach of the Roman plan.


## **Construction Update**
